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## Owners of Apple Devices Like iPhones Advised to Turn Off FaceTime App Until Apple Issues a Patch

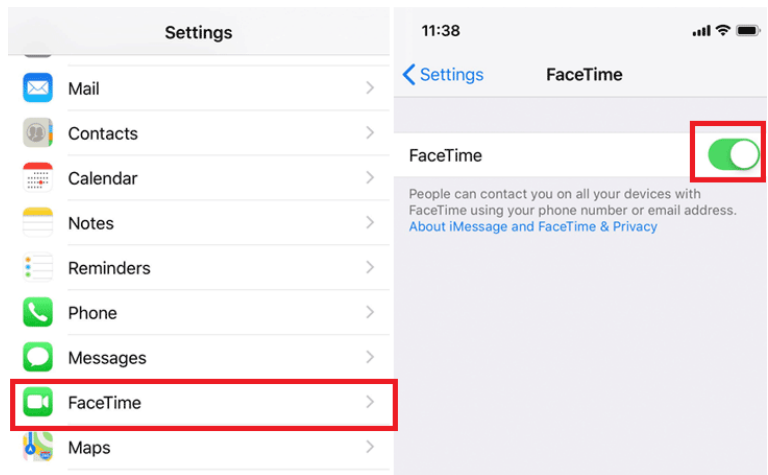
**Risk Management Question:** How can you protect your privacy in light of a significant vulnerability recently discovered in Apple’s FaceTime App?

**The Issue:** A significant vulnerability has been discovered in Apple's FaceTime’s App which allows a third party to remotely turn your iPhone, iPad or Mac into an eavesdropping device. Immediately turn off or disable the app on any Apple device you own. To do so, go to “settings,” scroll down to FaceTime (green icon with camera), and disable.
