

Amendment to New York State Labor Law Requires Employers to Display a Veterans Benefits and Services Poster

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On January 1, 2023, an amendment to the New York State Labor Law went into effect, requiring all employers in the state who have fifty or more full-time employees to display a Veterans Benefits and Services Poster in a conspicuous place accessible to employees in the workplace. The poster include the following information regarding veteran services:

The poster includes the following information regarding veteran services:

- a. Contact and website information for the division of veterans' services and the department's veterans' program;
- b. Substance abuse and mental health treatment;
- c. Educational, workforce, and training resources;
- d. Tax benefits;
- e. New York state veteran drivers' licenses and non-driver identification cards;
- f. Eligibility for unemployment insurance benefits under state and/or federal law;
- g. Legal services; and
- h. Contact information for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Crisis Line.
