While many who follow these issues closely agree that a rules-and-compliance approach may enhance overall cybersecurity, some, such as Mr. Puiszis, caution that banks and insurers should take a broader approach in effectively protecting against data breaches. As he notes in the article, “[w]hile a compliance approach is better than nothing at all, the problem is that compliance is not security[.] There’s a lot to security that people don’t think about, and if all they are doing is focusing on compliance, they are missing some important [issues].”
